

INTRODUCTION:


Shri Madhavrao Patil Mahavidyalaya is situated in Murum. It is affiliated with Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. The college offer various courses like B.Com., B.A., and B.Sc.at Under Graduation level and M.Com. at Post-Graduation level. Presently, over 1400 students are studying in college. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College has continuously been working on quality improvement and the betterment of student learning experiences. In order to analyze the lag areas of the college and scope for further improvement, feedback from various stakeholders have been received. This report focuses on the feedback of students on Syllabus and Teachers.

DATA COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS

An effort was made to receive feedback from all students of the college. For this purpose, a form was created and gave to students. As many as 25 responses have been received on Syllabus and Teachers from the students. In order to arrive to comprehensive results, useful statistical tools likepercentage, etc. have been used. Data was created by using Google form the students of various courses. As explained earlier, total 25 responses have been collected from the student, out of which 60% were male and 40% were female.









2. STUDENT FEEDBACK


















Above chart It was noticed that, 80% students have said that, Every time and 10% of them feel that, was usually. 10% students have responded that, was the occasionally or sometimes.













Context Diagram





Action Taken:

In view of identifying the gap in the syllabus as per the requirement of various stakeholders, the college has taken feedback on curriculum from the students regarding their subject. Suggestions like more smart and experiential leaning and approach to competitive exams, relevant to the framing of the syllabus of various courses were consolidated and discussed in IQAC, then communicated to the subject teacher.
